

Nine community housing providers funded to build 128 SA affordable homes

Nine community housing providers will share \$20 million in funding to deliver a total of 128 new affordable homes in metropolitan Adelaide and regional areas.

“More than \$2 million in funding has been allocated to Common Ground to build 12 new units in inner city Adelaide, building on the organisation’s excellent work with people on low incomes and people at risk of homelessness at their existing sites in Light Square and Franklin St,” says SA Social Housing Minister Tony Piccolo.

“Community Housing Limited has been awarded more than \$6.4 million to deliver a total of 25 new homes, with a specific focus on high-needs clients, such as people living with a mental illness.

“More than \$2 million in funding has been allocated to Common Ground to build 12 new units in inner city Adelaide, building on the organisation’s excellent work with people on low incomes and people at risk of homelessness at their existing sites in Light Square and Franklin St.

“Community Housing Limited has been awarded more than \$6.4 million to deliver a total of 25 new homes, with a specific focus on high-needs clients, such as people living with a mental illness.

“In total, 82 homes to be built under this package are dedicated specifically to people with high support needs, with 29 of these allocated specifically for people living with disability.”

Construction of all houses is scheduled for completion by the end of next year.
